Curricular hformation

Term 4 April to June 2019

Class: Primary 7

Literacy

This term Primary 7 will be exploring a variety of functional texts and will focus on analysing the different features of each. Pupils will create their own functional texts based on what they have learned including leaflets, instructions, reports and newspaper articles. Primary 7 will continue to participate in Reciprocal Reading sessions to strengthen their knowledge of key reading skills and roles. They will develop their comprehension skills by creating and answering a range of increasingly complex text based questions. Pupils will further develop their talking, listening and presentation skills by delivering a short author study to the rest of the class.

Numeracy



Primary 7 will continue to complete daily numeracy warm ups where they will consolidate and develop

their learning while discussing and sharing a range of strategies with one another. Pupils will continue to self-select the complexity of their work through 'Chilli Challenges' where they will be encouraged to challenge themselves and extend their learning. This term the class will be focusing on key concepts including number sequences and patterns, profit and loss, capacity, angles and measure.

Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies

As part of Primary 7's technologies topic, pupils will be tackling a variety of design briefs and challenges which they will then bring to life through use of a 3D printer.

Pupils will also be exploring changes of state through science.



Health and Wellbeing

Primary 7 will continue to explore strategies for resilience through the Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies (PATHS) programme where they will further develop their ability to recognise and deal effectively with different situations and emotions. There will be a focus on transitions and how to cope with the changes that will accompany their move to secondary education.

P.E.

The focus of PE this term will be athletics. Pupils will take part in a range of activities relating to athletics including long jump, high jump, sprints, relay races and ball games. Pupils will also participate in a range of team games including Ultimate Frisbee and rounders.

Religious and Moral Education



In religious and moral education, pupils will be exploring Islam with a focus on the key celebrations of Eid and Ramadan.

As a member of a multicultural school and city as a whole, pupils will be encouraged to develop a respect and understanding for world religions and the associated traditions and beliefs.
