Removal of snacks in the Fuel Zone 2019/2020

As you will be aware, all food and drink in schools must comply with strict Scottish Government legislation. Catering and Facilities Management (formally Cordia) are always looking for ways to further reduce the amount of sugar, salt and fats that are in the food and drink that we provide. Legislation will be tightened next year and it is likely that the maximum amount of sugar, fat and salt that is in food and drinks will be reduced. To plan for this, there have been some changes to the menu recently; no flavoured milk (only plain), removal of desserts (apart from yoghurt and fruit). The next change to the menu will be the removal of additional sales (to include snacks, fruit based drinks and home baking) in the Fuel Zone. This will mean from the new term in August there will be no mid-morning or lunchtime items sold.

Charity

Thank you for your support of our recent 'Go Yellow' event. It was a great success. P6 and P7 had a fantastic day at Bellahouston Park and the P1-P5 pupils enjoyed school based activities. Your generosity meant that the school was able to donate £583.78 to the Prince and Princess of Wales Hospice.

Mrs Hunter has worked with the Be All You Can Be Group to organise sunflowers for all the children to grow at home. We have been most impressed by the results with some beautiful flowers produced. The children also presented them at an assembly and helped to raise £192.71 for Marie Curie Cancer Care.
