Literacy



In term 3 Primary 4/3 will all learn to take notes when listening to or reading a variety of texts. They will use these notes to answer questions, summarise main points or create their own texts. Pupils will also be using their own notes to prepare a short talk to share with the class. In doing so they will learn about the importance of pace, gesture, expression and tone.

Numeracy



In our final term of Primary 4/3 pupils will be consolidating and extending their skills in subtraction and addition of two digit numbers through word problems. Pupils will also continue to build on their times tables with x7,8,9 and learn how to multiply two or three digit numbers. The class will also be introduced to equivalent fractions.

Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies



Our topic this term will be Fairtrade. Pupils will explore how Fairtrade helps farmers and communities around the world and follow the supply chain for some popular products in our supermarkets.

Using our 3D printer the children will design, model and print their own spinning top design. They will use computer aided design software and learn to test and evaluate their designs.

Health and Wellbeing



As part of our Fairtrade topic P4/3 will be cooking and baking in order to give the children the opportunity to taste a range of products from around the world. We will also discuss the importance of good food hygiene. In PATHS we will be discussing good manner and the importance of listening to others.
