Curricular Information

Term 1**Teacher: Ms Taylor and Mrs Houston****Class: P6**

Literacy

Children will study a variety of genres, and will be provided with multiple opportunities to write across the curriculum. We will be writing for a variety of different purposes across a selection of texts.



Reading will be taught using Guided Reading in class. Students will look at skills such as predicting, summarising and using inference to help build comprehension. This will allow them time to build and consolidate their reading skills.

Primary 6 will continue to follow the Alpha to Omega spelling program, making use of a variety of active approaches in class, and will be tested each Friday. Spelling words will be set as homework each night.

Please encourage your child to read for enjoyment at home as much as possible.



Numeracy

We will begin with the children consolidating their knowledge of place value, so that they can then apply it to the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). They will then be able to apply these skills to solve word problems.

In Primary 6 we will be using equipment such as the place value disks, place value boards and number lines to help us to add, subtract, multiply and divide. We will be encouraged to draw pictures of our solutions and use the equipment to help articulate our answers.

We will be focusing on the use of mathematical vocabulary in each lesson and the children will be expected to speak using full sentences when talking to our learning partners in class.

Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies

Mrs Houston will be teaching science and will be looking at how different animals are adapted to their habitats. The children will be looking closely at animal adaptations and creating detailed diagrams to explain them. They will be using technologies to help produce presentations, blogs and animations that we will share with the class and you!



We will also be looking at festivals and celebrations around the world and marking the similarities and differences between cultures, people and places, and environments.

Health and Wellbeing

Children will continue to build on their emotional literacy through the promoting alternative thinking strategy programme. Children will be learning to identify and discuss different feelings. Pupils will also be encouraged to develop a growth mind-set.

P.E.

Pupils will be learning ball skills, team work and co-ordination through a variety of activities and games.



Religious and Moral Education

The RME topic this term will be Islam with a focus on the five pillars of Islam.

Children will also be embedding the school values of respect, good sportsmanship, doing our best, kindness and honesty throughout each school day.



Expressive Arts including:

Art: Primary 6 will be creating art work in relation to their class topic, which is Carnival. We will be looking at the costumes and their influences. There will be a focus on line, tone, shape and colour using a variety of materials.
