# Curricular hformation

Term 4 May-June 2019

Class: P6

#### Literacy

Children will study a variety of genres, and will be provided with multiple opportunities to write across the curriculum . Pupils will be writing for a variety of different purpose across a selection of texts. The genres we will be focusing on this term are descriptive writing and persuasive writing.



Pupils will continue to engage in weekly literacy circles, where they work as a group to read and discuss the text they are reading. Students will practice skills such as predicting, summarising and using inference to help build comprehension. This will allow them time to build and consolidate their reading skills. Please encourage your child to read every night at home as this will help to widen their vocabulary and improve their writing.

Primary 6 will continue to follow the Alpha to Omega spelling program, making use of a variety of active approaches in class, and will be complete a spelling test each Friday. Spelling words will be set as homework each night.



### Numeracy

The focus this term will be decimals, fractions and percentages as well as consolidating numeracy skills through multi-step word problems.

Primary 6 will continue to complete daily 'Chilli Challenges' where they will be given the opportunity to self –select their level of challenge.

Primary 6 will work on applying the skills that they have learned in a variety of contexts with a focus on real life word problems.

#### Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies

Primary 6 will continue to work on their Island Explorers project in collaboration with Strathclyde University. The children have designed and are in the process of building sustainable solutions for food waste



on the island of Cumbrae. The children will be presenting their designs in front of a panel of judges in a 'Dragon's Den' style event.

### Health and Wellbeing

Children will continue to build on their emotional literacy through the promoting alternative thinking strategy programme (PATHS). The PATHS focus this tem will be friendship and responsibilities.

# P.E.

This term the children will be practicing their skills for school sports day, which is on the 9th of May. Children will practice and participate in events such as running races and relay races.



Primary 6 will also be learning rugby skills this term, developing skills in throwing and catching a rugby ball, building up to playing touch rugby.

#### **Religious and Moral Education**

Primary 6 will continue to learn about world religions with a focus this term on Ramadan and Eid.



Children will continue to embed the school values of respect, good sportsmanship, doing our best, kindness and honesty throughout each school day.

#### Expressive Arts including:

Art: Primary 6 will study the work of famous artists and recreate the artist's work using the artist's techniques.
