Literacy



This term, P2/1 are learning to re-tell stories and nursery rhymes. P1 are building phonological awareness through rhyme and clapping games, and P2 pupils are further developing their skills of constructing a sentence independently, blending sounds they know to make words.

Numeracy



P1 pupils are busy sorting and matching objects by size, colour and shape. We are also learning to write and identify numbers to 10. P2 pupils are learning all about numbers up to 100, building on their knowledge of Tens and Units to help them add and subtract.

Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies

Learning through play, P2/1 are enjoying simple coding by programming Bee-Bots. We are also using sand and water to investigate floating and sinking, and what makes things stop and go.

Our Health and Wellbeing sessions this term will focus on the importance of keeping school values.
