Literacy

Primary 6 will continue to engage with a variety of fiction and nonfiction texts during comprehension and close reading activities. Primary 6 will be introduced to Literature Circles this term during reading focus and will be encouraged to foster independence in the varying roles within each group.

Writing with Mrs Taylor on Fridays will focus on non-fictional pieces of text associated with both our health and hygiene topic and Scottish Assembly regarding St Andrew. Pupils will gather facts to annotate diagrams, make lists and write informative accounts and bibliographies. Our Handwriting will be practised every Thursday and a Spelling Test will be done every Friday morning.

Numeracy

Mrs Taylor will continue to cover practical maths. This term all groups will focus on data handling using various types of graphs. We hope to cover some work on measure and estimates as well as the use of co-ordinates before the end of term too.

P6 will also improve pupils rapid mental recall of multiplication facts with oral, mental and interactive maths games.

Health and Wellbeing

Following on from our Food and Health focus on hygiene we will look at electrical safety amongst other ways of keeping ourselves safe and healthy at home and outside. Nuffield Health will be visiting each Tuesday morning to develop the children's knowledge surrounding health and the importance of making healthy choices.

P.E. Mr Graham will be accompanying Primary 6 each Monday

for 4 weeks beginning on 21 October to the Pinkston outdoor centre where they will participate in activities related to the John Muir Award. P6 will also develop their sports skills in rugby with a Glasgow Life coach visiting us every Thursday.

Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies

P6 will be carrying out some science experiments following our learning about health and hygiene. Pupils have already learnt about Alexander Fleming and his discovery of antibiotic penicillin. A Nobel achievement which will inspire us to discover more about bacteria.

Dance Mat Typing will be available to pupils in P6 to practise their keyboard skills using the class computer. We have also selected two Digital Champions who will assist us with the many ways in which we can use the new iPads.

Religious and Moral Education
